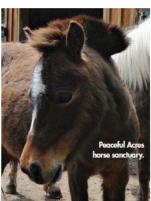

Your top tip for long-haul flights?

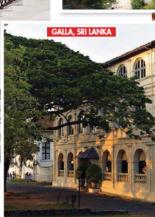
I love the single-window Business Class seat. If it's First Class, so much the better!
