

GLOBA



TEL AVIV, ISRAEL: The latest property to uncork in this beach city is The Poli House, which opens this month. From the same team who manage favourites like Brown Tel Aviv and Beach House Tel Aviv comes the White City's first project by starchitect Karim Rashid. 
